The Faculty of Medicine at Khon Kaen University was established in 1972, the first medical school in Northeast Thailand. The Faculty has grown dramatically since its inception. Currently, one-third of the university's personnel work for the Faculty, including academic lecturers, doctors, nurses, medical technicians and support staff.

Curriculum:

The MD (Doctor of Medicine) program requires six years and a total of 261 credits to graduate. The program is divided into three years of pre-medical and pre-clinical study and three years of clinical study. Problem Stimulated Learning (P-S-L), a Modular System and an integrated curriculum are used in the pre-medical and pre-clinical years.

- The three-year pre-medical and pre-clinical course includes:
- Year 1: Life and Life Cycle; Life and Environment; Learning Process; Professional Development; Man, Society and Culture; Art, Design, Music and Creative Thinking and General Principles for Medical Sciences I and II.
- Year 2 and 3: General Principles for Medical Sciences III and IV; Skin and Related Connective Tissues; Hematopoietic and the Lymphoreticular System; the Musculoskeletal System; the Nervous System; the Gastrointestinal System and Nutrition; the Endocrine System; the Urinary System; the Reproductive System; the Cardiovascular System; Correlated Basic Medical Science and Clinical Science; Introduction to Clinical Science and Community Medicine and Family Medicine I and II.
- During the clinical years, students perform supervised rounds in the hospital, attend lectures and practice at many affiliated hospitals. The three-year clinical course includes: Medicine; Surgery; Obstetrics and Gynecology; Pediatrics; Orthopedics; Rehabilitation Medicine; Community Medicine and Family Medicine III and IV; Psychiatry; Ophthalmology; Otorhinolaryngology; Anesthesiology; Clinical Radiology and Forensic Medicine.

The Faculty of Medicine at Khon Kaen University has established itself as a center for world-class research and tertiary patient care. The mission of the Faculty is to engage in innovative research activities for well-balanced and long-lasting development of the people of Northeast Thailand. We are proud to work for the benefit of the Isaan people. At present, the Faculty has four Research Centers of Excellence and 20 Research Groups which are very active in undertaking research focusing on the diseases prevalent in Northeast Thailand. One of the Faculty's missions is to instigate research activities for important diseases in the region affecting local communities.

Research Support Units – Research Affairs

Laboratory Animal Unit

The Laboratory Animal Unit has the important task of supporting research activities by producing, caring for and servicing laboratory animals for teaching, research, testing and biomaterials production. This unit also organizes seminars and academic conferences regarding the ethics and usage of laboratory animals for experimentation.

Ethics Unit

The Ethics Unit oversees and assesses research involving human subjects in the Biomedical Sciences, Health Behavior, Medical and Health areas, Social Sciences and Behavioral research projects.

Epidemiology Unit

The Epidemiology Unit provides support and consultation for faculty in the research planning and analysis of research.

Research Funding and Financial Support

Faculty Grants

Khon Kaen University's goal is to be an excellent research university. The Faculty encourages and supports the development of technologies and research by its staff. The Faculty provides research funding in the form of grants for staff researchers, including:

1. Invitational research scholarships

Invitational research scholarships support manuscript publication by interns, residents, fellows, graduate students and academic staffs.

2. Commissioned research scholarships

Commissioned research scholarships are provided to Academic Affairs and Srinagarind Hospital for doing research on policy development.

3. Research group scholarships

Research Affairs provides Research Group Scholarships for the support of multidisciplinary research which cannot get financial support through regular funding mechanisms; such as for small group meetings to do preliminary studies and literature reviews for proposal.

4. Routine to research (R2R) scholarship and clinical outcome research

Research Affairs provides financial support for research to improve the efficiency of patient treatment. The purpose of this scholarship is to decrease patient and hospital expenses and to get the results published.

5. Research leadership fund

The Research Leadership Fund supports and promotes health and sanitation research in Northeast Thailand. A primary goal is for researchers to publish their manuscripts in an international journal.

6. Systematic review

Support is given to researchers publishing systematic reviews in international journals.

7. Research assistantship

The Research Assistantship provides support for research assistants to increase finalization of research manuscripts for publication in international journals.



Student Affairs

HRH Prince Mahidol of Songkla, the father of modern Thai medicine, advised medical students: "I don't want you to be only a doctor, but I also want you to be a man"— to be a whole compassionate person. In this respect, medical students at the Faculty are responsible for setting more than thirty of their own activities each year while the Faculty facilitates another six.

Student activities include health promotion, recreation, ethically oriented activities, community services, academics, cultural awareness, environmental preservation, welfare, career counseling and student-teacher exchanges.

The students, along with a designated teacher/advisor, organize more than 10 clubs; for example, the Computer Club, the Classical Thai Music Club, the Western Music Club, the Photography Club, the Football Club, the Aerobics and Ballroom Dancing Club, and the Environmental Conservation Club.

The Faculty holds an annual Student Council election, The committee for student affairs provides counseling, dormitory management and scholarships.







International Collaborations





The Faculty recognizes and appreciates the value and importance of academic and cultural exchanges between other universities at home and abroad and consequently has increased its participation in exchanges over the years. Such liaisons provide an opportunity to understand the differences in clinical and cultural approaches to medicine in different countries and cultures. Srinagarind Hospital

In 1975, Srinagarind Hospital commenced providing medical services in a temporary site located on Srithan Road. In 1976, HM the King, Bhumibol Adulyadej, placed the foundation stone for the current hospital and named it "Srinagarind Hospital" in honor of his mother, HRH the Princess Mother,

Srinagarind Hospital is the only medical-school-associated hospital in Northeast Thailand. It offers all the specialties and sub-specialties available in Bangkok. For some specialties such as cholangiocarcinoma and renal stones, both endemic to the Northeast, Srinagarind Hospital is a world leader in treatment and research.

The hospital has a dedicated organ transplantation team. For example, 32 kidney transplantations are performed annually, second only to Ramathibodi Hospital in Bangkok.

The hospital is a center for research statistics including a regional Cancer Registry. At present, there are 1,200 beds with 21 operating theaters, 11 nursing care departments, a blood bank and daycare facilities. 690,000 out-patient cases and 40,500 in-patient cases are attended to each year.









The Blood Transfusion Center (Est. 1979) supports blood transfusion therapy at Srinagarind Hospital and the Queen Sirikit Heart Center. Activities include: donor recruitment, blood collection, blood donor testing, blood component preparation, compatibility testing, teaching, training and research. The center also serves as a regional reference laboratory for; proficiency testing, problem-solving, blood supply monitoring and academic support to the public and to other blood banks in Northeast Thailand.

The blood bank collects 32,000 units of blood annually; all of which is tested for anti-HIV, HIV antigen, HBsAg, Anti-HCV and syphilis antibodies, to ensure a safe blood supply. Blood components, including packed red cells, leukocyte-poor red cells, leukocyte-depleted red cells, platelet concentrate, fresh frozen plasma, frozen plasma and cryoprecipitate, are prepared and controlled to meet international standards; apheresis for platelets is conducted using an automatic cell separator.

Apart from the blood transfusion service, the Blood Bank also provides HLA-typing, kidney and bone marrow matching for transplantation, hematopoietic stem cell collection and investigations for transfusion reactions.

Academic activities include teaching Blood Banking and Transfusion Medicine for 3rd-year medical students, medical technology students and postgraduate training in biomedical sciences.

Research projects include: appropriate use of blood components, development of techniques for red cell serology, molecular biology in major histo-compatibility complexes and transplantation.

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Srinagarind Day Foundation

In December 1997, the Faculty of Medicine, Khon Kaen University received permission to set July 18th as "Srinagarind Day" in memory of HRH Princess Srinagarindra, the Princess Mother. The "Srinagarind Day Foundation" was established to receive donations to help patients with insufficient financial resources. In the inaugural year, the Faculty received a 2,110,000-baht royal grant. On November 10th, 2008, HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn agreed to be the patron of the "Srinagarind Day Foundation".

Another foundation directly serving the underprivileged is "The Faculty of Medicine Foundation". This foundation is administrated by the hospital's social welfare department.

Vision

The Srinagarind Day Foundation is to help relieve the financial burden of the poor coming to Srinagarind Hospital and to support medical students needing financial assistance.

Mission

- 1. Administration of the Srinagarind Day Foundation to be under committee
- 2. Donations to be used to defray treatment expenses of the poor;
- 3. Some donations allocated for research by medical students or scholarships for medical students needing financial assistance; and,
- 4. Some donations may be used to assist other charitable organizations.







Queen Sirikit Heart Center of the Northeast

The Heart Center of Northeast Thailand, a 200-bed facility, was built to commemorate the 60th birthday of HM the Queen. June 17th, 1991, the Heart Center received permission from HM Queen Sirikit to use her name for the Center. December 30th, 1992, a Royal Decree officially established the Center. January 24th, 1994, HRH Crown Prince Maha Vajiralongkorn placed the foundation stone for the Heart Center and March 9th, 2006, the Center was completed.

The Heart Center's responsibilities include: education, research and academic services for cardiovascular disease in the Northeast.

The Queen Sirikit Heart Center for Northeast Thailand is to be a center of excellence for cardiovascular treatment and research and for training specialists in this field for service in Thailand and neighboring countries.

Emphasize and improve cardiovascular treatment, academic services, research and support graduates studying cardiovascular science.



Khon Kaen University is one of the four regional universities established in 1964 as part of a plan to decentralize higher education in Thailand. KKU is the primary educational and learning center in Northeast Thailand and is recognized as the leader of new innovations in teaching, learning and research in Southeast Asia. The campus is situated just a few kilometers from the center of Khon Kaen City which is the trade and administrative hub of the Northeast and is on a main transport route between the capital and the Mekong Sub-region. Thus, KKU is ideally located to support the development of the Northeast and neighboring countries. From its humble beginnings, the university now has more than 34,000 students studying in 17 faculties, with one satellite campus (in Nong Khai), 1 demonstration school and 3 colleges. Currently, KKU offers 40 International and English programs covering almost every discipline.


